The past year has been a tale of two halves. Our trade for the first six months of the financial year was severely inhibited by the Government's Covid Protection Framework (aka Traffic Light System). Whilst the latter part of the year had no restrictions on trade, satisfying the significantly increased demand for our businesses was incredibly challenging due to the historically low unemployment rate.

Despite the challenging conditions, the ILT Group has continued to grow Donations to the community back to pre-Covid levels, returning \$8.4 million for the year. In the 16 years of operation, the ILT Foundation has returned almost \$93 million in grants.

Grants returned to the community for the year ended 31 March 2023 totaled **\$5,868,869**.

ILT Foundation remains focused on ensuring the greatest level of funding is returned to our community through prudent

operational structure and cost management.

ILT Foundation has always recognised gaming as a sensitive product, very aware of the social responsibilities.

We are committed to providing safe and enjoyable gaming venues, minimising gambling harm where possible.

We proactively seek out opportunities to work collaboratively with community partners to return funding to all sectors of our community.

GROUP FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2023

The consolidated group consists of:

- Invercargill Licensing Trust
- ILT Foundation
- The equity accounted value of the Invercargill Licensing Trust's investment in DB South Island Brewery Ltd.

The ILT Group achieved a surplus, before donations and tax, of \$12.623 million for the year to 31 March 2023. The Group continued to provide a high level of donations totalling \$8.379 million to local community organisations.

OVERVIEW

- The Invercargill Licensing Trust recorded a much higher level of surplus before donations and tax this year at \$7.377 million. Donations made were \$2.510 million and tax of \$1.887 million, leaving a surplus after donations and tax of \$3.520 million.
- Value of Associated Company: The value of the Trust's investment in DB South Island Brewery Ltd decreased by \$324,000 for the year.
- The ILT Foundation achieved a surplus before donations of \$5.570 million. Donations made were \$5.869 million, leaving a deficit after donations of \$299,000.
- The level of donations made to the community for the year totalled \$8.379 million.

INVERCARGILL LICENSING TRUST (PARENT)

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE: The Invercargill Licensing Trust's surplus before donations and tax is \$7.377 million. This level of surplus before donations and tax is comparable to what was achieved pre-Covid.

Please note the following:

- The Invercargill Licensing Trust's Financial Performance for the year ended 31 March 2023 is currently being audited by KPMG. Prior year audits for 2020, 2021 and 2022 are undertaken by Audit New Zealand and remain outstanding.
- The cost of The Langlands Hotel is \$52 million. The surplus before donations and tax for the year ended 31 March 2023 does not include impairment for The Langlands Hotel.
- Total sales and income for the year were \$110.211 million. The sales include The Langlands Hotel, which started operations on 22 September 2022.
- The total cost of sales, excluding employment expenses for the year, was \$62.227 million.
- Total operating expenses for the year were \$39.807 million. This includes employment expenses at \$26.556 million, depreciation at \$3.339 million, fuel / power / repairs and maintenance and other operating expenses at \$10.015 million.
- Investment income for the year was \$345,000.
- Interest expense for the year was \$579,000.
- Donations for the year were \$2.510 million.
- Taxation for the year was \$1.887 million.
- Net surplus after donations and tax was \$3.520 million.

FINANCIAL STRENGTH: The Trust's financial position remains strong, with a conservative level of term debt and total assets of \$104.489 million, including The Langlands Hotel. The trust has a strong working capital of \$17.549 million.

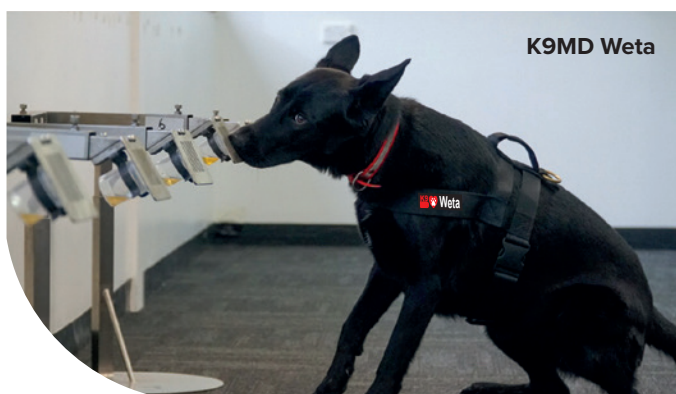
K9 MEDICAL DETECTION

Dogs are renowned for their exceptional sense of smell, but the dogs from K9 Medical Detection have taken their abilities to new heights. These incredible animals are now trained to detect bowel cancer, simply by sniffing urine samples.

At the helm of this organisation is Pauline Blomfield, Founder and CEO, who started the venture in 2018. She proudly asserts, “We are doing world leading research and are passionate to create a new diagnostic test for early cancer detection.”

Pauline emphasises that the dogs’ detection work does not aim to replace any step in the medical process but serves as an additional tool for surgeons. “It provides them with more information to make informed decisions regarding patient prioritisation, allowing for earlier treatment and alleviating some of the strain on the healthcare system.”

The facility houses a diverse range of dog breeds, including German Shepherds, Labradors, Springer Spaniels, and a Red Retriever.

Pauline acknowledges the pivotal role played by Invercargill in advancing this research.

“The Southland community has been incredibly supportive, with Southern Cross Hospital coming on board early. Local surgeon Professor Konrad Richter has facilitated K9MD’s work in Southland and is crucial to our ongoing success. We are fortunate to have two nurses to collect patient samples and educate them about this groundbreaking initiative.”

“The funding received from ILT has been instrumental in covering the costs of nurses and transporting crucial samples to our research facilities.”

A recent milestone celebrated by K9MD involved K9 Weta and K9 Levi successfully detecting bowel cancer in patient urine samples. Pauline describes this achievement as a world first and a significant step forward in early detection of bowel cancer in New Zealand.

However, the team’s aspirations extend beyond bowel cancer, as they are actively training and developing the dogs to detect both prostate and ovarian cancer.

Pauline eagerly mentions, “Expanding our K9 family with a dog from local Flagstaff Labrador Kennels thanks to ILT’s funding, will be a wonderful addition to our team.”

In the meantime, the dogs will continue their medical detection training under the guidance of their amazing trainers. It’s not all hard work though, the dogs have a good work-life balance, being cared for by foster families and kept in top physical condition by their veterinary team.

SOUTH SEA SPRAY WAIHŌPAI

The inner-city walls of Invercargill are adorned with beautiful artwork, courtesy of South Sea Spray Waihōpai.

In December 2022, the latest edition of this colourful street art festival brought together 24 artists to Invercargill. Following successful iterations in various locations around the region, including Motupōhue (Bluff), Aparima (Riverton) and Māruawai (Gore), with their Street Alive version.

The festival's founder and organiser Danny Owen, also known as Deow, was inspired by his experience attending other festivals around the world and throughout the country.

"While those festivals were great, I thought we could do better, we could do something special," he said.

Since then, South Sea Spray has flourished. While the main aim is to create vibrancy and inspirational high impact artworks, its impact extends far beyond that to support street artists, grow emerging talent and inspire the next generation.

"We are here to advocate for the artists, highlighting their value and sharing our renowned Southern hospitality with them. We take such good care of them that they keep coming back," Deow added.

South Sea Spray Waihōpai attracts famous street artists who converge upon the town to create their magnificent murals. Each year, the organisers also include several up-and-coming artists aiming to foster the growth of the next wave of creatives.



"There are some incredibly talented young artists out there and we want to help them grow."

He further elaborated, "Most artists, including me, begin as graffiti artists, festivals like this provide a chance to extend their skills and evolve from graffiti to murals." The artwork predominantly narrates local stories, often illustrating the connection between mana whenua and the region.

Deow attributes the festival's success to active community engagement and backing from local funders.

"We try to add value through connecting with the community. There are plenty of opportunities for people to engage with the artists at workshops and walk throughs," he explained.

"Our community funders have also been amazing. We were in the fortunate position of getting support from all of them, which was incredible and helped make the festival a success."

"It's awesome to see the community support we have down here, I'm not sure it can be replicated anywhere and we're looking forward to continuing to build on that."

The organisers have plans to continue to grow the festival in Southland, proposing alternating years between Invercargill and other locations across the region.

"The event has been so successful that we're now getting business owners approaching us asking to be involved. They've seen the success of the other festival and want to be part of it too."



BUILDING MITEY CHILDREN

19 primary schools across Southland have embraced a new approach to mental health and resilience education through Mitey.

This pioneering initiative, owned and operated by the Sir John Kirwan Foundation, recognises the crucial importance of the mental well-being of our tamariki.

Catering specifically to primary school children in years 1 to 8. It takes a comprehensive school-wide approach that involves the entire school community, including students, their whānau, the board, teachers, and all staff.

Southland is leading the way in implementing this progressive approach beyond Auckland and is being driven by regional coach Belinda Brown.

During the initial phase of Mitey, Belinda provides support to teachers by establishing specific learning in the classroom around wellbeing, tailoring the learning and approach to each school's needs together with ensuring a school has an environment that promotes the wellbeing of everyone in it. Subsequent ongoing support, along with labs and workshops, is made available to sustain the momentum of each school's Mitey journey.

Belinda elaborates, "Mitey is designed to work alongside the school's own culture and values. Learning in mental health education can be worked into other areas of the curriculum like inquiry, athletics, literacy or art. Mental health education can be seamlessly integrated into everyday teaching."

Belinda, like all Mitey coaches, is a trained senior teacher with a deep commitment to an education-based focus with positive health outcomes.

"We're aiming to break down the stigma surrounding mental health and ensure that the next generation grows up feeling mentally healthy."

Funding from ILT plays a pivotal role in supporting the coaches, enabling them to provide resources and professional development to the teachers from nine Invercargill-based schools.

Paddy O'Brien, ILT Chair, said the board recognised Mitey as an opportunity to make meaningful inroads into youth mental health education and for Invercargill to lead the way once again.

"It ties together three areas that have always been a priority for us; youth, mental health and education. It provides valuable tools to some of the most vulnerable members of our community," he said.

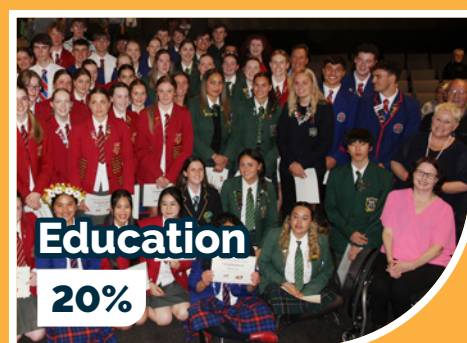
